Illinois' Prenatal-to-Age 3 (PN3) Policy Agenda


In order to reach more families, we have **four policy-specific goals**. We work to advance these goals through **eight interconnected and targeted strategies**.



Cost of Care Calculator

The true cost of child care outweighs reimbursement.



\$1,182 / month = NOT inclusive of options that improve programs quality, such as adequate salaries or classroom resources.



Child Care is Critical

In Illinois today:

- Capacity of licensed childcare gives access to only 25% of infants and toddlers across the state
- Many communities have access rates of less than 10%

Our Priority

- Provide professionals with training, compensation, and support
- Increase investment in family and center-based care



Infant & Toddler Child Care Roadmap

We connected with child care providers from across the State to listen to their perspective and develop concrete recommendations for a path forward in Illinois:

"You know, if you look at statistics, one of the lowest paying jobs in the state is a child care teacher or assistant ... we're asking them to do the greatest thing, which is take care of the children..."

"Preschool teachers should have love, thought, practice and innovation. **They are intelligent teachers who are good at thinking**, which is also the requirement of the new era for preschool teachers."

"Despite the challenges, many participants shared that they still believe the work of child care professionals is **important and rewarding**, and that **passion for children and families** is an important prerequisite for being a good teacher."



Economic Insecurity

In Illinois today:

- 59% of workers cannot even access unpaid leave
- Women are breadwinners in nearly 66% of families
 - 84% of Black families, 49% of Latinx families, 48% of White families
- Women are 96% of workers in the childcare industry

Our Priority

- Increase awareness, enrollment and uptake of WIC, SNAP & CCAP
- Ensure family-friendly work policies like paid leave




Economic Insecurity

- 84,693 of Illinois' children aged two and under lived below the federal poverty line.
- This is nearly 1 in 5 children aged two and under.

Poverty is the single greatest risk factor to child development.

From the Prenatal to Three Risk and Reach Report developed by the Erikson Institute and the Illinois Early Childhood Asset Map (IECAM)





Early Intervention

In Illinois today:

- Only 4% of children under age 3 in Illinois receive Early Intervention services
- More than 3 times as many qualify for Early Intervention services

Our Priority

 Increase access to Early Intervention for children with developmental delays



Birthing Inequities in Illinois Today

- Black women are 6 times more likely to die of a pregnancy-related condition than White women
- Babies born to Black women die at 2 to 3 times the rate of babies born to White women
- It is literally a matter of life and death.

Our Priority

Ensure comprehensive perinatal supports for all – with help before,
 during, and after birth.

Key Wins in Illinois

- Children exposed to lead are now automatically eligible for Early Intervention
- No more gaps in Early Intervention for children born in summer

Our Priority

- Increase focus on Infant Mental Health
- Invest in professional development like **bilingual certification** and
 - mental health credentialling
- Anchor on addressing historical injustices



Home Visiting, Doula Programs, & Universal Newborn Supports

These services provide physical and socioemotional help to new families, supporting the **health and well-being** of parents and children

Our Priority

- Invest in home visiting, doula and universal newborn supports
- Increase funding for home visits
- Increase compensation, training and supports for providers
- Ensure family awareness and incorporation of family voice

Policy & Advocacy Work Underway

Critical efforts are underway to bolster the well-being of our youngest:

Our Priority

- Call for a 10% increase in funding for key early childhood services
- Work towards the systemic changes put forth by the Early Childhood
 Funding Commission
- Create the **strong drumbeat of support** for the changes that our youngest learners need

Key Wins in Illinois

- Reduced gaps for children with developmental delays
- · Families will continue to receive services via telehealth
- Medicaid funding for home visiting and doula services
- Increased access to socioemotional support via Infant Mental Health Consultation
- Increased efforts to develop and support the pipeline of early childhood providers

"Increased access to crisis and mental health services."

"Access to a **diverse**, **equitable learning environment** that centers on child brain development and play."
