
ADDRESS ILLINOIS' EARLY INTERVENTION (EI) CRISIS IN THE FY26 STATE BUDGET

Increase funding by \$60 million to help eliminate unprecedented waitlists


The Early Intervention (EI) program provides a range of family-centered developmental and social-emotional services to infants and toddlers who have or are at risk for significant developmental delays and disabilities. These critical services improve developmental outcomes for young children, support families to better meet their child's needs, and reduce future educational and health costs to our communities and the state by minimizing the need for special education services. **EI is an entitlement for families** and serves children from all income levels and in every county across the state.

SERVICE DELAYS ARE HISTORICALLY HIGH AND HAVE NEARLY DOUBLED SINCE FY22

While the EI program's caseload continues to increase, the loss of EI therapists and service coordinators is having a substantial impact on the provision of timely services. Thousands of families across the state are currently on waiting lists for the EI services they are legally entitled to receive, and the service delay percentage has nearly doubled to historically high levels.



THE EI WORKFORCE IS IN CRISIS



Recognizing the urgent need to reduce long waitlists for families and address the continued decline in EI providers, IDHS-DEC commissioned a <u>cost model study</u> to understand the cost of delivering EI services. **IDHS-DEC recently released its report, which shows that Illinois must invest \$168M more annually to pay for the full cost of delivering all EI services**. This includes an increase to provider rates by an average of 95% (estimated cost of \$150M annually) to fully cover providers' costs and time, and an increase to Child and Family Connections (CFC) grants by \$18M to account for adequate staffing and minimum salaries for service coordinators. **The <u>cost model</u>** <u>report</u> underscores the immense need for investment and massive funding gap in pay for the workforce.

BABIES CANNOT WAIT – INCREASE FUNDING AND RAISE PROVIDER REIMBURSEMENT RATES

The Illinois General Assembly has an opportunity to address the EI program's stubbornly high service delays and workforce crisis. We urge the legislature to increase funding for the EI program by \$60 million in the FY26 budget, allowing IDHS to authorize a substantial rate increase for providers and get closer to the investment needed to stabilize the program. More therapists will leave Early Intervention entirely without immediate action, causing further harm to infants, toddlers, and their families. The time to act is now.
